Currently, Medicare pays just 90 percent of the actual cost of care for hospitalized elderly patients, our largest population of inpatients.

UMHS has met fiscal challenges head on. In the face of sweeping change, we do not merely respond, we lead. UMHS is nationally recognized as an innovator in healthcare reform. We spend each dollar wisely and find creative solutions to increase our efficiency, affordability, and accessibility while also raising the bar of patient care and biomedical investigation.

In the arena of research, academic medical centers as a whole have seen unprecedented cuts in funding from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) in recent years. In an increasingly competitive marketplace for grants, UMHS won more than 1,021 separate NIH awards in 2013, totaling over \$400,000,000.

To move forward in a time of scarce funding, we have also sought key partnerships with industry. As a result of our outreach and excellence, UMHC is repeatedly chosen as a principal site for prestigious multi-center trials that position us to innovate. Our research is inextricably intertwined with patient care—and it saves lives. In January, for example, we were the first hospital in the world to implant a new device that treats thoracic aortic aneurysms.

Excellence begets opportunity. Your past commitment to UHMC has been instrumental in assuring and supporting our continued advancement. You and like donors have helped us reach important milestones and achieve essential outcomes.
